Entrance Fee: A fee of £10 per household is suggested.

Route: Prior to the event walkers will be sent a map with waypoint markers. Walkers

can choose to walk either the short route (aimed at children and anyone with

mobility issues), or the long walk (for those who like a challenge).

Start time: the walk can start at any time between 10:30 am and 2:00 pm from Long Acre.

Waypoints: Please take a photo to start the walk at Long Acre and then at each waypoint

marked on the map you have been given. End your walk with another photo at

Long Acre. There will be quiz questions to answer at each waypoint.

Awards: anyone who completes the quiz will be entitled to a small prize.

Lunch: the routes include waypoints at or near pubs, though only one directly on

route serves lunch. You may want to take a picnic.

Payments: Sponsored contributions should be collected and paid by the end of May.

Safety: Make sure you wear sensible walking shoes and clothes. Take some water

with you. Take a smartphone – you will need this for waypoint photos and in

case of problems enroute.
