

Village Hall On-Line Booking System!!

We have a new online booking system for the village hall. We've put everything you need for booking, along with some photos and information.

You can currently pay online using PayPal (you don't have to have an account) and we are aiming to have another simple online payment system soon.

We've changed the bookings so that the hall can be booked by the hour. If the booking includes villagers, then we have kept the charge to £5 per hour.

During term time the school uses the hall for lunch and assembly and occasional other bookings, and you will see these booked in the calendar. They pay a contribution towards our running costs. However, the charitable purpose of the Village Hall Trust means that village events take priority, so wherever possible we try to be flexible. If you need the hall during the day in term time, please contact our hall booking team via the booking site.

Administration of bookings, providing keys etc will be handled by Lucy Carter, Rebecca McLaurin and Ann Mawby in future. Please be patient with us as we get used to using the new system, we are a new team :-)

Protect the Village Greens and Verges

The Parish Council goes to some considerable effort and cost, in seeking to maintain the Greens and Verges, which ensure a rural feeling and a more open environment in our village. To that end, we would be grateful if Residents could avoid parking on the greens and verges in order that we can maintain them in optimum condition. This also applies to visitors, contractors and, above all, delivery drivers, so we would be grateful if you would pass the word on to all such drivers. It is recognised that there is an issue with onstreet parking in the village and it would obviously be helpful if those who have off-street parking on their property utilise the same, thus avoiding any need to park other than on-street (and not on-green or on-verge). Some of the problem is created by major contractors (Severn Trent etc) and where possible, the PC does hold them to account for repairing the verges - not always successfully.
